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# Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### June 5, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2025 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund aims to provide long-term capital appreciation by primarily investing in, or gaining exposure to a portfolio of fixed income and/or equity securities with no geographic restrictions by investing primarily in exchange-traded funds. The Fund will target a neutral mix of 30% fixed income and 70% equity, but has full flexibility to invest up to 100% in any asset class. The Fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in exchange-traded funds managed by the sub-advisor or its affiliates.

### Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for investors who intend to hold the Fund as a small component of a diversified investment portfolio and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

The Fund is currently available for investment only by other IG Wealth Management Funds.

## **Results of Operations**

### **Investment Performance**

The performance in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

For the year ended March 31, 2025, the Series P securities returned 10.3% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the MSCI World (Net) Index returned 13.7% and the FTSE World Broad Investment-Grade Bond Index returned 9.6%.

Global equity market performance was mixed over the period in response to shifting expectations regarding central bank monetary policy and geopolitical tensions. The materials sector was negatively affected by subdued commodities demand in China. Currency movements generally boosted returns in Canadian dollar terms. In response to cooling inflation and weaker labour markets, many major central banks cut their policy rates, with the exception of the Bank of Japan.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Africa and the Middle East and North America were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while Japan and Asia Pacific (ex Japan) were the weakest. The financials, utilities and communication services sectors were the strongest performers, while materials, health care and consumer discretionary were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the MSCI World (Net) Index, in part because of exposure to the U.S. information technology sector. The Fund outperformed the FTSE World Broad Investment-Grade Bond Index, in part because of exposure to Canadian equities and international fixed income investments.

iShares S&P 500 Information Technology Sector UCITS ETF, representing about 5% of net assets at the end of the period, was the largest detractor from Fund performance. iShares Core S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index ETF, representing about 14% of net assets, was the largest contributor to Fund performance.

The Fund reduced its holding in iShares Core U.S. Aggregate Bond ETF and increased holdings in iShares Short Treasury Bond ETF and iShares Core MSCI EAFE ETF because of the portfolio management team's concerns that recent U.S. policies could lead to higher inflation. The Fund closed an underweight position in the information technology sector, driven by market activity after the Fund eliminated a previous position in Technology Select Sector SPDR Fund and added a position in iShares S&P 500 Information Technology Sector UCITS. The Fund closed an overweight exposure to iShares MSCI Eurozone ETF during index rebalancing. The Fund's holding in iShares MSCI United Kingdom ETF increased because of strengthening economic growth in the United Kingdom.

### **Net Assets**

The Fund's net assets increased by 6.6% during the period to \$1.1 billion. This change was composed primarily of \$101.9 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$36.2 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

### **Fees and Expenses**

The management expense ratio ("MER") during the year ended March 31, 2025, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets. No management fee or administration fee, other than certain specific fund costs, is charged to the Fund. The MERs are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

## **Recent Developments**

The portfolio management team believes economic developments in early 2025 have challenged investors with both shorter-term and longer-term investment horizons. U.S. policymakers have shown a willingness to accept near-term economic pain for long-term gains. Meanwhile Europe, and to a lesser extent China, have embraced economic stimulus. The team expects U.S. inflation to rise because of tax cuts and the U.S. economy to slow as a result of increased tariffs. In this environment, the Fund maintains underweight exposure to longer-term U.S. bonds and modest overweight exposure to equities, with a preference for developed markets outside the United States.

### **Other Developments**

Subject to regulatory approval, on July 1, 2025, the Distributors, Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., will merge into a single, dual-registered dealer named IG Wealth Management Inc. that will operate as an investment dealer with a dedicated mutual fund division.

### **Related Party Transactions**

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is only available for purchase by other IG Wealth Management Funds and is not available for purchase by retail investors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor and Trustee are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The following sub-advisor provided investment services to the Fund:


Certain other investment funds, distributed by IG Wealth Management, and other qualified investors may invest in Series P of this Fund. As at March 31, 2025, this series comprised 100.0% of the Fund's net assets. The Manager relied on standing instructions approved by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee for the execution of all such transactions, which are based on the net asset value per security determined in accordance with the stated policies of the Fund on each transaction day. Investments by other investment funds in the Fund increase the risk of large redemption or purchase orders, which could result in larger than normal cash positions in the Fund for short periods of time. This could have an impact on the Fund's operations. However, the Manager uses various strategies to minimize the potential dilutive impact associated with large cash positions. These strategies may include transferring securities in-kind where possible, utilizing ETFs to maintain market exposure in lieu of cash and spreading transactions in smaller increments over a period of time.

# **Past Performance**

The Fund's performance information assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or other optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns or performance. The past performance of the Fund is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

## Year-by-Year Returns

The following bar chart presents the performance of Series P of the Fund for each of the fiscal periods shown. The chart shows, in percentage terms, how much an investment made on the first day of each fiscal period, or on the series inception or reinstatement date, as applicable, would have increased or decreased by the last day of the fiscal period presented. ## Annual Compound Returns

All index returns are calculated in Canadian dollars on a total return basis, meaning that all dividend payments, interest income accruals and interest payments are reinvested.

Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by affiliates of the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

## **Management Fees**

The Fund is only available for purchase by other IG Wealth Management Funds and is not available for purchase by retail investors. In order to avoid duplication of fees in the other IG Wealth Management Funds, the Fund does not pay a management fee.

## **Fund Formation and Series Information**

The Fund may have undergone a number of changes, such as a reorganization or a change in manager, mandate or name. A history of the major changes affecting the Fund in the last 10 years can be found in the Fund's Annual Information Form.

The Fund may issue an unlimited number of securities of each series. The number of issued and outstanding securities of each series is disclosed under *Financial Highlights*.
