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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2023

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2023 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "IGIM" and "the Manager" refer to I.G. Investment Management, Ltd., the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

On February 16, 2023, the IG Wealth Management Funds' Independent Review Committee approved a proposal to wind up Investors Group Corporate Class Inc. and merge its suite of Corporate Class funds into corresponding trust fund equivalents because it was in a taxable position. As a result, investors holding securities of IG Mackenzie Global Consumer Companies Classs (the "Predecessor Fund") were merged into the corresponding series of the Fund on a tax-deferred basis on May 19, 2023. The fees, the investment objective and strategies, and the portfolio management team of the Fund are substantially similar to those of the Predecessor Fund. Consequently the information in this report is presented as if the Fund had existed since the inception of the Predecessor Fund.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

In accordance with National Instrument 81-106, the following comparison to one or more market indices has been included to help you understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the portfolio management team cautions that the Fund's mandate may be different from the index or indices shown. Also, it is important to note that investors cannot invest in an index. Indirect investments in an index are available; however, there are fees and transaction costs and other variables that will impact returns when investing in these products. Index returns included in the comparison below do not reflect these costs and variables. In addition, unlike the index, this Fund may be subject to valuation adjustments as outlined in the Fund's valuation policies as it relates to non-North American equities held either directly or indirectly by the Fund. A fair value adjustment can either positively or negatively impact the Fund's rate of return.

For the returns of all series and for longer-term performance of the Fund, see the *Past Performance* section of this report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses may differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. See *Series Information* for the annual expense rates for each series.

For the six-month period ended September 30, 2023, the Series F securities returned -0.6% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the Fund). In comparison, the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index, returned 3.5% and the Fund's narrow index, the MSCI World Consumer Staples and Consumer Discretionary (Net) Index, returned 0.3%. Given the Fund's mandate, the narrow index has been included as a more meaningful comparison.

Global equities rose over the period as central banks slowed the pace of their rate increases. The global economy proved resilient, and employment remained strong. With high inflation persisting, the U.S. Federal Reserve, European Central Bank and Bank of England increased their policy interest rates, albeit at a slower pace. Higher interest rates and inflation contributed to tight financial conditions, which weighed on demand and hindered manufacturing sector activity.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Norway, Italy and the United States were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Hong Kong, New Zealand and Finland were the weakest. The communication services, energy and information technology sectors were the strongest performers, while utilities, consumer staples and real estate were the weakest.

Global consumer spending remained relatively robust over the period despite rising interest rates and high inflation. Consumers benefited from strong labour market conditions and excess savings built up over the pandemic, which helped boost spending. Given the relative health of global consumption despite tight financial conditions, consumer discretionary stocks ended the period higher. Conversely, the more defensive consumer staples sector declined as a resilient global economy led investors toward higher-risk investments.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index, with overweight exposure to the consumer staples sector detracting from performance and overweight exposure to the consumer discretionary sector contributing to performance.

The Fund underperformed the narrow index, with overweight positions and stock selection in the Netherlands and the United Kingdom detracting from performance. In industry terms, underweight exposure to automobiles and stock selection in food products detracted from performance. Stock selection in the consumer staples distribution and retail industry and the specialty retail industry contributed to performance relative to the narrow index.

Over the period, the Fund's exposure to the United States and to the consumer discretionary sector increased as the portfolio management team added new positions, including consumer technology related companies. Exposure to the consumer staples sector decreased because the team believes the market is likely to reassess the earnings resilience of food-related companies given the increased focus on weight-loss drugs.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 10.1% during the period to \$142.6 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.8 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$15.2 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2023, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The United States economy has thus far been robust, due to large fiscal stimulus, the drawing down of excess savings from the pandemic period and the delayed impact of rising rates on U.S. mortgages. The portfolio management team believes inflationary pressures in Europe have eased as monetary policy tightening and cost-of-living pressures have cooled consumer demand. Higher interest rates increase European mortgage costs more rapidly than in North America, which has been disinflationary for house prices. Europe should enter the winter heating period with near-full gas storage, which reduces the risk the region faced last year following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and lower wholesale energy costs are reducing utility bills for consumers.

Although the Chinese economy has shown some signs of stabilizing, consumption and investment, including in property, have not yet recovered meaningfully.

Volatility has increased in several consumer segments, including luxury, which has suffered from weak sentiment toward China and normalizing growth trends.

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Other Developments

With the approval of the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee, the Predecessor Fund merged into the Fund on May 19, 2023.

Related Party Transactions

I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. is the Manager and Trustee, and Mackenzie Investments Europe Limited is the Portfolio Advisor of the Fund. The Fund is offered through the Consultants of Investors Group Financial Services Inc. and Investors Group Securities Inc., together referred to as the Distributors. The Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Distributors and Trustee are, indirectly, wholly owned subsidiaries of IGM Financial Inc.

The Fund paid a management fee to the Manager and Portfolio Advisor for management and portfolio advisory services (see *Management Fees*).

The Fund also paid the Manager an administration fee and in exchange the Manager paid the operating costs and expenses of the Fund, except for certain specified costs.

The Fund paid the Distributors a service fee as compensation for providing or arranging for the provision of services to the Fund, including the issue or allotment of securities.

The Trustee is responsible for the overall direction of the affairs of the Fund. The Fund paid the Trustee a fee for its services.

Securityholders in Series F also pay an advisory fee directly to the Distributors. This fee is not included in the Fund's expenses.

The Manager relied on an approval issued by the IG Wealth Management Funds Independent Review Committee to proceed with the merger of the Predecessor Fund into the Fund on May 19, 2023.

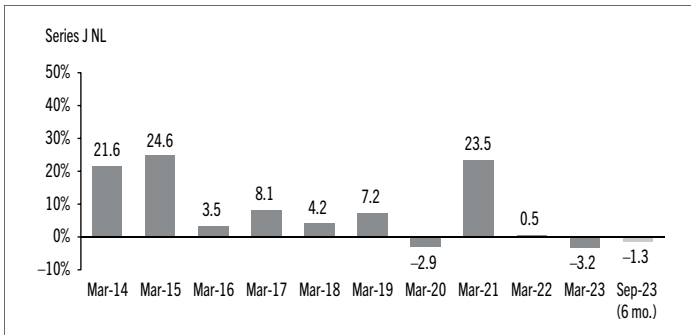
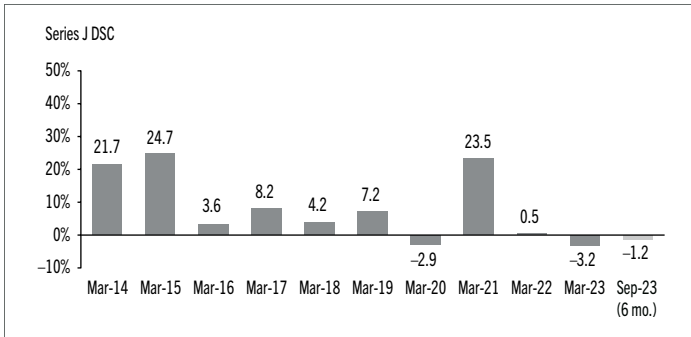
Year-by-Year Returns

- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

Management Fees

The Fund pays a management fee, and this fee, paid by each series, is calculated as a percentage of the net asset value of the series at the close of each business day (see *Series Information* for rates payable by each series). Generally, management fees pay the costs incurred to provide investment advisory and management services, as well as distribution-related services provided by the Distributors.

However, in the case of Series F, securityholders pay the Distributor an advisory fee (separate from the management fee) directly. Therefore, the management fee in that series is used for investment advisory and management services only.

For all other retail series (i.e. those that exclude Series R, P and S, if issued), approximately 67% of management fees paid during the period was used for investment advisory and management services, and approximately 33% related to distribution-related services. This may vary by series.
